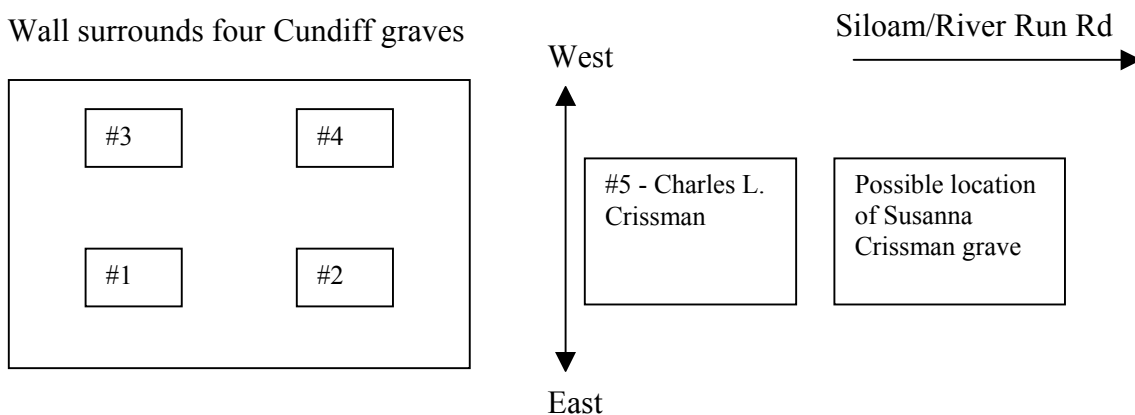
## APPENDIX C

### CRISSMAN CEMETERY

Charles L. Crissman is the only known Crissman buried in the Crissman-Cundiff Cemetery.

Cemetery directions: take SR #1003 (Siloam Road) south from Hwy 268 at Level Cross; take a right on SR #2230 (Siloam/River Run Road) and go west about 1.2 miles. A rock wall surrounds the Cundiff section on the left. This burial plot is in the yard of what is now known as the "Milton Cundiff House." As you enter the cemetery from the West, Charles L. Crissman's grave is to the right and back of the Cundiff section (location 5 below). The grave of Susanna N. Carter Crissman is believed to be buried beside her husband Charles as requested in her will and that for the lack of a marker, lost to future generations.

Aaron Crissman is buried in an unmarked grave on the property now known as the Luther Key Farm on SR #2101 near Siloam, NC. His second wife, Nancy Elizabeth (Betty) Key Crissman is buried at Pine Hill Friends Church, Hwy 268, Siloam, NC.
